Dear Parents and Staff,

On January 22, we had the first monthly Home and School Meeting of the calendar year. (The next meetings are February 19, March 26, April 30, and May 21.)

Here are the highlights of the meeting:

- 1. Parents were asked to sign up for various volunteer opportunities: Lost and Found, library help, lunch time help, International Night on March 27, the Craft Fair on May 10, and Catholic Schools Week. Parents who were not able to attend can email the office or the principal to express interest in any of these. Since the meeting, one parent has volunteered to help with Lost and Found and setting up a 'gently used' uniform supply in the school where parents could shop for items at reduced prices. More when this is ready to open...
- 2. The NEASC Accreditation Committee asked that the schools review the Mission Statement to more reflect the Catholic foundation of the schools. Parents were asked for input, what to keep, what to add, etc. There will be a parent survey later in the year which will include questions about the Mission and suggestions for its updating.
- 3. Parents discussed some fundraising ideas such as starting the auction again, have school nights at family-owned restaurants, a Walk-a-Thon when the weather is warmed, more family nights, and selling items. Some attendees volunteered to work more on ideas; again, parents who'd like to help, please email the office or the principal.
- 4. Future fun activities such as a Grandparents Day, the Talent Show, a spaghetti dinner with the Knights of Columbus, and summer camp or summer school were discussed. The idea of camp was of great interest, so I will be talking to staff about how this would look. More to come...
- 5. The recent diocesan safety training was reviewed. Blue U is the company; it has a different approach from the training many educators have previously received. (Please see the newsletter of January 16.) A few misconceptions that were cleared up: the parking lot is not a public one. Staff are always alert to unfamiliar cars or people near the buildings. When we had the Blue U training on January 13, there was a car in the parking lot that did not belong to the school or church. The police were notified and took care of the situation. Parents were notified of this by an email that day. The school is required to run 6 fire drills and 4 safety drills in a school year. Blue U is offering its safety training again; please see further down in this newsletter for the link.
- 6. It was also discussed how to get more parents to attend the monthly meetings. Sending an email reminder the day before, offering a free dress down, and providing babysitting were a few suggestions. We are checking with some of the OLMA students about being babysitters as service to the community. Other ideas are welcome.

Thank you to the parents who attended the meeting, and thank you to the parents who faithfully read this newsletter. As always, I encourage any parent who wants a question answered or who has a concern to please speak with me.

A final thank-you to the families who spoke at St. Bernard and St. Margaret Mary last weekend. Your talks were from the heart and so supportive!

And thanks to all of our staff for making this week a great one for our students. Happy Catholic Schools Week!
