Dear Parents and Staff,

Don't forget the Home and School meeting on Wednesday, January 22 at 6:00 pm in the Parish Hall at St. Bernard. There will be a general update on school topics and a beginning list of ways that parents can become more active at the school. The current list includes help with our ever-popular Lost and Found supply, volunteering during lunch or in the Library, helping with certain events such as International Night, the Craft Fair, and some Catholic Schools Week activities (January 27-31.)

We had our annual visit from Blue U to do training required by the Diocese of Manchester. The security expert from Blue U visited classrooms and talked about the number one threat to schools, an active shooter. Most of us have heard about hiding and being quiet, or running away, but not as much about fighting against an intruder. The approach of Blue U is to give staff and students a 'fighting chance.' While this is an unusual approach for most of us, Blue U explains that preparing staff and students for anything else is not being honest about the intruder situation. The only change we have made at SJRS since this visit is keep doors closed and locked. Blue U recommends for all schools that they have a secure entry into the school, have a radio alert system and have ongoing training. I have told staff that I would like to create a safety committee going forward. If any parent has expertise in this area and would like to offer guidance, please let me know.

A final note is that our awesome 8th Graders visited OLMA on Friday and had a presentation about our high school. We will be offering a special incentive for any students who complete the OLMA application by January 31...something fun with Mr. Sully, the OLMA Dean of Students.

Note: for those looking forward to the annual Talent Show, it has been delayed from the end of January and is currently being planned to take place in conjunction with a spaghetti dinner sponsored by the Knights of Columbus.


