ASH WEDNESDAY/LENT INFORMATION

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it too. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he says the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Priests administer ashes during Mass and all are invited to accept the ashes as a visible symbol of penance. The ashes are made from blessed palm branches, taken from the previous year's palm Sunday Mass. It is not required that a person wear the ashes for the rest of the day, and they may be washed off after Mass. However, many people keep the ashes as a reminder until the evening.

On March 5, we observe Ash Wednesday and begin the Lenten Season. Please note that Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. The school will only be offering meatless sandwiches/hoagies for lunch that day. The following Wednesdays in Lent, the sandwiches/hoagies will be the regular offerings.


